### Yeltsin, drunk and in underpants, found by Secret Service

"But I want a pizza!" or something equally surprising was how Boris Yeltsin tried to explain to Secret Service agents why he was wandering around Washington, (1) **clad** only in his underpants, clearly worse the wear from drinking something a trifle stronger than coffee.

This surprising (2) **engagement** and near international scandal (3) **has been revealed** last week in Taylor Branch's new history of the Clinton years, *The Clinton Tapes: Wrestling History with the President*, which was based on over 70 interviews Branch recorded with the former president. The interviews took place late at night at the White House between 1993 and 2001, the year Clinton (4) **rescinded** office. They were Clinton's idea – he wanted someone to capture his White House years as they (5) **had happened** – in an intimate way which could not be achieved retrospectively. Branch and Clinton shared a flat back in 1972 when both were working on George McGovern's presidential campaign.

Clinton (6) **confided** in Branch that his affair with Monica Lewinsky happened at a time when he was cracking under the pressure of a series of political and personal (7) **backtracking**, including the Republicans losing Congress in 1994 and the death of his mother. The former president was initially reluctant to discuss the Lewinsky affair (8) **in spite** of his fear that Branch's taped interviews could be (9) **subject to** subpoena and used against him in court. (10) **Yet** by August 1999, six months after surviving the Senate impeachment trial, Clinton (11) **was opened up** to Branch in a number of highly emotional, late night talks. In an interview with USA Today Branch expressed the opinion that Clinton's wandering eye had been worse in the past, but that he had made a resolution to change once in office because there was too much (12) **on stake**. He commented that Clinton believed "...he succeeded 99 per cent, but then felt sorry for himself and (13) **retreated**."
